

COMMUNITY LEGAL SERVICES

The services are organized by legal topic and grouped into three categories.

1. A **community resource** (designated in orange) allows an individual to get acquainted with the law, courts, and legal materials necessary to represent herself in court (pro se).
2. A **legal clinic** (designated in green) allows a client to meet with an attorney for advice, but does not create an ongoing legal relationship or court representation by the attorney.
3. A **referral program** (designated in blue) provides connections for clients to meet attorneys who will work on their cases and represent them in court, if needed.
